

## Lusher Drama Troupe 2019/2020 Audition Information Packet

## I. Basic Information

### ACCEPTANCES:

**ACTORS** Parents of students in grades 3-5 will be sent an email with the acceptance rosters of all performance troupes by the evening of Wednesday August 28th. **STAGE MANAGERS** Parents will receive an email by the evening of August 30th.

**PRODUCTION:** Seussical KIDS

**REHEARSAL TIMES:** Tuesdays, 3:30-5:30 and additional special rehearsals on Saturdays as needed before the production date and additional performances (Block Party and Crawfish Boil)

PERFORMANCE DATES: Saturday May 9th @ 2:00 pm Monday May 11th @ 6:00 pm Tuesday May 12th student matinee performances

TUITION: Full time Lagniappe students: \$225.00, non-full time Lagniappe students: \$360.00

**NOTE FOR PARENTS:** Acceptance decisions are determined using a rubric by a team of faculty members with theatre training and experience. Results are final. There will be no post-audition in-person, email, or phone conferences regarding a student's audition or interview.

\*Per Lusher Arts rules, you can participate in only one performing troupe each year. As such, students will only be allowed to accept membership in one of the following: Drama Troupe, Dance Troupe, or Drama Company. \* Make sure you sign the permission slip on page 4 and bring to audition/interview.

### \* Do you want to be a stage manager?

#### What does a stage manager do?

- 1. Takes notes on what actors do on stage
- 2. Helps organize and give information to actors
- 3. Helps actors perform the correct lines
- 4. Helps the director organize rehearsals and performances
- 5. Assists in ensuring performances are successful

#### If you want to be a stage manager:

- 1. You must be a 5th Grader
- 2. Prepare for a 10-minute interview
- 3. Be prepared to have a discussion about theatre
- 4. Be prepared to have a discussion about your goals
- 5. Be prepared to discuss your academic performance in school

### Do you want to be an actor?

#### What does an actor do?

- 1. Helps tell the story of the play through a character
- 2. Memorizes lines and blocking
- 3. Works with fellow actors
- 4. Listens to a director and music director
- 5. Respects his/her collaborators

#### If you want to be an actor:

- 1. You must be a 3rd, 4th, or 5th Grader
- 2. Prepare for a 10-minute (max) audition involving speaking, dancing and singing

#### ★ Here is what you should prepare for your audition:

- Students should choose and prepare ONE of the monologues included on page 5 of this packet. Memorization is not mandatory but is highly encouraged in order for the student to be able to better showcase their ability to connect and portray the character as effectively as possible.
- Students will be asked to sing up to 15 seconds (maximum) of a song of their choosing (a cappella, no accompaniment will be provided) in order to demonstrate their vocal ability. They should choose a song that they feel comfortable singing and that highlights their personality and performance style!

#### ★ What will happen in your audition, step-by-step

- 1. Students will report to the Goldring Center at 3:30, sign in and assemble in the theater.
- 2. In groups of about five, students will be called into the audition room (the dance studio).
- 3. Once in the audition room, each student will be asked to perform their monologue.
- 4. After all students have performed their monologue, each will take a turn performing their song.
- 5. After all students have performed their song, some music will begin. At this time the student will freestyle dance. They should follow their impulses while using their bodies to demonstrate the genre and rhythm of the music.
- 6. Students will be thanked for their time, effort and risk-taking.

# **III. Parent Information**

1. Acceptance decisions are determined using a rubric by a team of faculty members with theatre training and experience. Results are final. There will be no post-audition in-person, email, or phone conferences regarding a student's audition or interview.

2. Rehearsals will happen every Tuesday after school from 3:30-5:30 pm (with some additional Saturday rehearsals added as we near performances).

3. After auditions, you should plan for your student to go to After Care (Lagniappe) or be picked up. Any student who goes to After Care and is not registered in After Care will be charged a drop in fee. The drop in fee for the afternoon is \$13.00.

4. If your student is accepted into the Drama Troupe, there will be a parent meeting designed to go over logistics and expectations. Please note the fee for participation in Drama Troupe needs to be paid directly to the Business Office at the Willow St. campus in the form of a check, money order, debit or credit card. The office cannot take any cash. There will be no refunds unless there is a decision to drop the program within the first two weeks. **Payments will be due on Friday, September 27th.** 

5. Please keep in mind that because of the popularity of Drama Troupe, many students audition. The size of the troupe must stay at a certain level. Because of the high demand and necessary limitations of acceptance slots, the Troupe's acceptance rate is low. Please remember that the Drama Troupe is not the exclusive opportunity for your student to have meaningful and successful engagement with theater. We also offer the opportunity to audition for Drama Company (2nd - 5th graders), and there are non-audition based theater classes offered in the Lagniappe program, as well as other opportunities for students to participate in theater during their regular exploratory curriculum in the school day.

## IV. Illness Policy

If students are ill on the day of the audition

- Parents must notify Mrs. Santos (ashley\_santos@lusherschool.org) the day of auditions before 3pm
- Parents must provide a doctor's note confirming the student's absence
- Parents must coordinate with Mrs. Santos to submit a video audition before Tuesday, August 28th
